Seven Foods to Energize Your Day!

The following is a synopsis of a great blog post I found on a nutrition science site called whatsupusana.com.

Here are seven foods to pump you with energy!

1. Quinoa - This ancient grain has no gluten and far fewer starches than rice and other grains. So, adding it as part of a snack or meal will help keep your blood sugar levels healthy!
